The Revolution seemed secure and complete, but Louis's reluctant consent to change was only thinly disguised by the fiction that his obstinacy was solely due to the malign influence of his court. Jacobin Club meetings soon became a place for radical and rousing oratory that pushed for republicanism, widespread education, universal suffrage, separation of church and state, and other reforms. The question soon arose whether the estates should meet separately and vote by order or meet jointly and vote by head thus assuring a majority for the third estate, whose membership had been doubled.
